

Uniform Violation Policy

It is the responsibility of the homeroom teacher to check for proper uniform attire each morning.

Minor Violations such as missing a belt or improper socks:

3rd violation: student given warning and reminder of policy by the homeroom teacher

4th violation: e-mail or phone call to parents made by the homeroom teacher

6th violation: student given a consequence by the homeroom teacher and parent notified

8th violation: student conference with the principal; principal makes a phone call home; student given a consequence

10th violation: student conference with principal. Principal will issue a consequence and set up a parent-student-principal conference with parents.

Subsequent violations: Principal will issue appropriate consequence which may include in-school suspension.

Major Violations such as missing uniform shirt, wearing improper pants/shorts/jumper/skort, or wearing improper attire on TAG days:

Student sent to office to call parents for a proper change of clothing. Student waits in office for parent to arrive.

The violation is also counted in the minor violation accounting.

If parent cannot be reached or is unable to bring a change of clothing, proper uniform can be borrowed from The Closet if available. If not, student issued consequence and charged with two violations in the minor violation accounting.
